ITINERARY 1



Take a picnic from one of Buxton's many excellent cafes and take the bus to Earl Sterndale. Enjoy your picnic in the Upper Dove Valley whilst embarking on the Dragon's Back walk

Hop back on the bus to Hartington and explore this charming village. Don't forget to visit the Hartington cheese shop.

To complete your day, take the bus to Tissington for a well-earned afternoon tea at Herbert's Tearooms.



ITINERARY 2



Take the bus to the charming village of Hartington for a lovely Derbyshire lunch at one of the many pubs and cafes.

Enjoy an afternoon walk to Longnor (6 miles) through the quaint villages of Derbyshire and across ancient lands, including the site where Pilsbury Castle once stood. This easy navigable route can be found on many walker's websites. Explore the historic village of Longnor and its cobbled market square, before taking the bus back to Buxton.

ITINERARY 3



Take the bus to Ashbourne and explore this historic market town boasting 200 listed buildings. Don't miss the splendid facade of the Grade I listed Old Grammar School; the 'longest inn sign in the world' outside The Greenman pub; or the beautiful St Oswald's Parish Church with its striking 212 feet high spire, described by classic author George Eliot as the 'finest single spire in England'.

Ashbourne sits at the start of the traffic-free Tissington Trail so why not hire a bike from Ashbourne Bike Hire, Repair and Service Centre, just outside Ashbourne town centre and cycle to Tissington, one of the prettiest villages in Derbyshire offering some picnic-friendly spots where you can have some lunch. Return to Ashbourne to catch the bus back to Buxton.

Described by the Sunday Times as one of England's most scenic bus routes, the 442 bus journeys through the beautiful Derbyshire landscape on its way between **Buxton to Ashbourne**.

Spend time discovering the attractive market towns of **Buxton** and **Ashbourne** and take a bus journey through picturesque villages steeped in history.

Discover countryside walks following the River Dove, visit cosy pubs and sample the local food and drink, and take in the dramatic scenery along the way.

This leaflet contains a timetable, map, handy information on great destinations and must-see locations, and even itinerary suggestions.

Day tickets are perfect for hopping on and off the bus and exploring the entire route. Take advantage of the Derbyshire Wayfarer ticket and connect with other buses and rail services in the area.

The Wayfarer is a day rover ticket allowing unlimited bus travel on most services throughout Derbyshire for a whole day

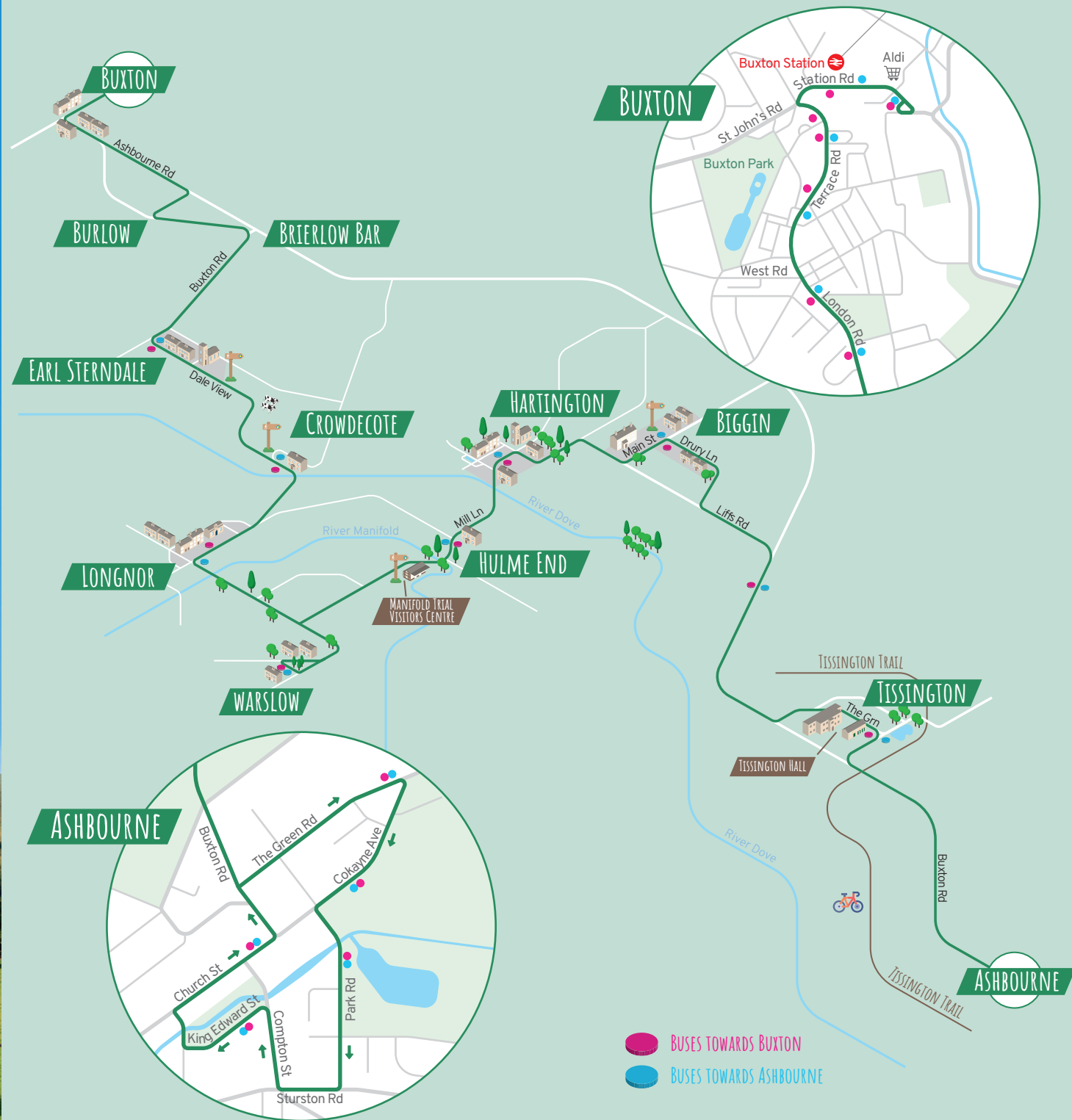

Buxton is a picturesque town known for its stunning natural scenery, historic architecture, and cultural attractions.

Located in the heart of the Peak District it is famous for its thermal springs, first discovered by the Romans who built a settlement in the area.

The town has a long history as a spa destination, with the Georgian and Victorian architecture in the town centre reflecting its past as a fashionable resort. Buxton is surrounded by beautiful countryside with plenty to offer visitors.

Earl Sterndale is a popular base for walkers set in the foothills of the dramatic Parkhouse and Chrome Hills in the Upper Dove Valley. Take a hike up Chrome Hill, known as the Dragon's Back.

This is a delightful family-friendly 5.4-mile hill walk that takes you through some of the most picturesque countryside in the Peak District. The walk starts from the bus stop at the Quiet Woman pub.

Crowdecote is a small, picturesque hamlet situated on the River Dove. Enjoy a walk to the English Heritage site of Pilsbury Castle, built by the Normans to control and tax the trade along the valley. Enjoy a picnic by the River Dove. The walk starts from the bus stop at the Packhorse Inn.

Longnor is a historic village nestled between the Dove and Manifold valleys. At the heart of the village is a lovely, cobbled square complete with 19th Century Market Hall. Explore the cobbled lanes and stone cottages and indulge in a delicious milkshake at Sweetilicious.

Hartington is a charming old limestone village famous for its cheese. The village is centred around a beautiful square and duck pond with some fine old buildings including the Charles Cotton Hotel, St Giles Church, the Market Hall, and Hartington Hall.

The village is set in the midst of outstanding scenery and ancient walking routes. There is a good selection of gift shops, cafes and pubs, a small pottery and cheese shop.

Hulme End is a lovely village, situated beside the River Manifold. It is the perfect start for an easy, accessible walk along the Manifold Way (3.7 miles) to Thor's Cave, a naturally formed cave named after the God of Thunder.

Why not stop for refreshments at the Wetton Mill tearooms along the way.

Biggin is a small, isolated farming village popular with walkers who come to walk beside the river Dove through Beresford Dale and Wolfscoate Dale.

The Biggin Walk (6.5 miles) is a popular walk that includes a national nature reserve and starts at the bus stop on Main Street.

Ashbourne is known as 'The Gateway to Dovedale'. Take a leisurely walking tour around town to immerse yourself in its fascinating history and architecture.

Ashbourne boasts more than 200 listed buildings - including historic almshouses, fine coaching inns and genteel townhouses.

Ashbourne sits at the start of the traffic-free Tissington Trail so why not hire a bike and explore this popular cycle trail.

Tissington is one of the prettiest villages in Derbyshire, situated close to the Tissington Trail and has been the estate village of the FitzHerbert family since the 1460s.

Explore this unspoilt picture postcard village with its 200 year old lime trees, picturesque cottages, and the splendid Tissington Hall.

The old coach house has been converted into a popular tearoom, why not enjoy a bite to eat!
